*Kampala students of 4e and 3e are once again participating in the **KITABU Literary Prize** initiated by the French school of Nairobi, Denis Diderot, and extended to schools in the region last year.*

***Promoting reading**, meeting authors, sharing reading experiences with students from other colleges, these are the objectives of this literary prize, which voluntarily targets students aged 13 to 15, a period when many teenagers lose interest in reading.*

*This year's selection is the **result of a dialogue** between literature teachers and librarians from the French schools in **Nairobi, Kampala, Dar Es Saalam, and Maputo.***

*The purpose of the prize is, of course, **the final vote** - in May - of students from each institution for the novel that won their adhesion, aroused their enthusiasm as a reader.*

*But the real highlight is **the meeting**, in spring, with one of the authors of the selection.*

*This year, the writer Rachel Hausfater has accepted our invitation and we are pleased to welcome her in Kampala to meet her young readers **from April 16 to 21, 2018.***
